## Integrated care for people living with memory problems.

Do you have memory problems or dementia?

Or are you caring for someone with memory problems or dementia?

If yes, researchers from the University of Newcastle are recruiting people with dementia or memory problems and their carers from the Greater Newcastle region of New South Wales.

## Who can participate in the study?

People who are aged 65 years or older and have memory problems or dementia can participate in this study. They must also have a family member or friend (carer) who is willing to take part.

## What is this study about?

This study will see whether having a nurse to help coordinate your care can increase the time you spend living at home with as much independence as possible. It will also test whether the assistance of a nurse can help with improving quality of life.

What will you be asked to do?

What does the involve?

- A researcher will visit you in your home to ask some questions about your health and to confirm your eligibility for this study.
- If you decide to take part in this study, you will be allocated to receive usual care or usual care plus the nurse-led care program.
- If you are in the group that gets nurse support, a nurse will visit you in your home and will ask about your health and support needs.
- The nurse will talk to your GP to help you plan your care, connect you to services and support, and provide four personalised consultations over 6 months.
